

Letter from the President

Happy Spring - -can you believe it?

2022 is in full swing as NSTRA's spring trial season progresses. I just returned from the Quail Forever trial. The South Carolina Region does a wonderful job hosting the trial and the fields are "second-to-none"; the weather was near perfect with 21 regions represented by dogs and handlers. The final hour included two handlers competing in their first National Final Hour. This competitive and exciting brace from start to finish was the icing to the cake as I enjoyed starting another new year - -reuniting among my national NSTRA family and friends.

Congratulations to the Quail Forever winner "Gracie" and Mark Clore as well runner-up "Gauge" aptely handled by the weekend birthday boy, Bo Nutt. Rounding out the top six: "Blazer" (3rd) and Brial Boals, and Blazer, "Ally" (4th) and Mikeal Mulberry, "Auggie" (5th) and Jack Little, and "Ziva" (6th) and Dale Heaton.

This was my first shot at being a National trial Chairman and it was refreshing to see everyone acting in an adult manner. The officials were on top of their game and without any controversy. My "team" included: Mike Barker, John Holder, Stan Purdue and Bob McCandless as judges; Lori Sprick and Dominique Boucher as marshals; and, Debi Heaton as trial coordinator. These individuals ensured that everything ran smoothly...I cannot thank them enough!

National trial officials are regularly recognized - -especially when you are reading these NSTRA magazines. However, this calls to mind my next thoughts - -what about the judges, marshals, scorekeepers, and bird planters that ensure our regional trials run smoothly?

As handlers, we often forget in the heat of the moment of a controversial call that judges spend eight or more hours in all types of adverse weather from below zero, snow, freezing rain, rain, wind, fog, and intense 100-degree temperatures. These individuals do their best to evaluate your dog properly. Judges generally perform a task that is vital to our game because they love participating, and if they are like me, for that one moment in a brace when a dog just "wows" you!

As handlers, we often forget the critical role of field marshals and scorekeepers; these are the persons who track the work of the judges, who are tasked with watching for "everything", answering every question, and solving every problem throughout the day.

As handlers, we often forget about that individual who is on "standby" all day long with intermittent activity that is crucial to the trial - -the bird planter! We complain about the slowness of his/her plant, the repetitive placement, or the birds are down "too hard", or the birds are not dizzied enough, or...you know that story! My special thanks go out to bird planter, Noah Sheriff.

My point is this: our officials make or break a trial. No matter how many dogs and handlers enter a trial, the trial will not occur if there are not dedicated officials. Thank your trial officials at every opportunity - -the meager compensation that most regions or local clubs offer is not sufficient to off-set the long hours, the distances driven, and other incidental costs involved with this activity. Before you harass or berate

an official, consider the impact your actions have on the trial/region/NSTRA organization - -oh, and by the way, we have a rule against such negative behaviors toward judges!

I am extremely pleased to note that we are moving along very quickly toward a regular publication of our magazine - -back on a bi-monthly schedule and almost exactly caught up! This is exciting! I know that we need to buckle down editing issues and resolve some photo captioning, but what a wonderful turnaround this is. I hope all of you appreciate the work of Marilyn Cunningham and her creative team.

Along those lines, we NEED material from the regions in order to make this magazine more than just a National Trial feature publication. As regions or as individuals, send us your photos - -properly captioned. As regions or as individuals, send us your articles and stories. Share the good news of NSTRA.

NSTRA will be present as an exhibitor at the National Pheasants Forever Conference and Trade Show in Nebraska this next month. Upcoming in April 2022 is the National Trial of Champions and the inaugural Trial of Amateur Champions in Amo, Indiana.

NSTRA MEMBERS - Important things to remember!

Reminders – check back often!

National trials are the responsibility of the National Officers with input from the Board of Directors and the local co-chairs of national trials. Criteria for entry, which may be subject to change, for the original 5 National Trials is available in the reference section of the Rule Book beginning on page 41, Section 11. If a particular national trial is subject to changes in the entry criteria, there will be notice provided on the official entry form, in the magazine, on the national website, and/or by email if available.

To enter a national trial, you may submit a hard copy official entry form and payment, OR you may scan and email an official entry form with payment information, OR you may send by facsimile and official entry form with payment information, OR you may enter and pay on-line on the website. NO EXCEPTIONS.

Please note that additional new national trials may be added from time to time and do not yet appear in the current Rule Book. Please contact your National Officer Representative or the National Office staff for additional information regarding such trials. The current list of National Trials is as follows:

QUAIL FOREVER, formerly known as Quail Invitational. This is a revolving trial generally held in February.

TRIAL OF CHAMPIONS. This trial is held in Amo, Indiana, in April.

NATIONAL AMATEUR TRIAL OF CHAMPIONS. This trial is held in Amo, Indiana, in April.

UKC PERFORMANCE TRIAL. This trial is a revolving trial generally held in June.

PURINA ENDURANCE CLASSIC. This is revolving trial generally held in September.

DOG OF THE YEAR. This trial is held in Amo, Indiana, in October.

TOP PERFORMANCE AWARD:
To be eligible:

*Dogs must have at least 20 open points accumulated in weekend trials between June 1 through May 31 of the applicable year. Once a dog is eligible, a schedule of scoring is applied based on the results at regional elimination trials and National Trials

*The Performance Trial will be the

beginning national trial each year, even if it ends prior to June 1 in order to keep the number of national trials the same each year.

*The Regional Elimination trial results used in calculating Top Performance Awards is the regularly scheduled regional elimination championship in the qualifying year/season (only one regional can count per year). Regionals scheduled or rescheduled to be held after June 1 will apply to the previous year. Each regional elimination will have a point value of 600 points. The value will drop 25 points per placement until the last dog or points run out (1 – 600, 2 – 575, 3 – 550, etc.). The placement for the regional eliminations is determined by the score of the last round in which the dog ran. In addition, 100 points will be awarded to the Champion, 75 for the second-place dog, 50 for the third and 25 for fourth.

*The National Trials results are calculated as follows: A dog must place in the top 32 dogs to receive a qualifying score from that trial. Each national trial will have a point value of 800 points. The value will drop 25 points per placement throughout the Saturday cut (1 – 800, 2 - 775, 3 – 750, etc.). The placement for the national trial is determined by the score of the last round in which the dog ran. In addition, 100 bonus points will be awarded to the Champion, 75 for second place, 50 for third and 25 for fourth.

HALL OF FAME NOMINATIONS:

Hall of Fame nominations will be accepted in a rolling calendar throughout the year. Send these nominations to the national office, or to a national officer no later than March 31 of the year in which a dog is to be considered. Nominations of dogs to the NSTRA Hall of Fame are NOT “carried over” to following years. Plainly stated, a dog that does not get elected to the Hall of Fame in the year nominated must be re-submitted in order to be considered for election. The National Officers, in concert with the Board of Directors, make selections to the Hall of Fame each April.

TRIAL SCHEDULES:

Fall/winter trial schedules are due in the office by May 1. Spring/summer trial schedules are due in the office by Nov. 1. All trials must be published on the website 4 weeks prior to their running.

SANCTION FEES:

Trial sanction fees are required BEFORE a trial packet is mailed and before a trial may be “approved” in the system. Please pay all sanction fees at least 4 weeks prior to your trial date to ensure prompt mailing of the packet and to ensure that the trial may be drawn in a timely manner.

TRIAL REPORTS:

Trial reports and results should be entered into the trial draw system as soon as possible after a trial and no later than 10 days after the trial date. Overall results will not be approved until the reporting is complete. First place points and championships will not be confirmed or awarded until the reporting is complete. (This includes receipt of all registration paperwork for placing dogs.)

HOME REGION:

Members requesting a change of Home Region must do so, in writing, through the National Office between the dates of October 1 and January 1.. *Exception: A member who permanently relocates to within the boundaries of a Region, other than their Home Region, may make written application to the NSTRA office at any time to request a change in their Home Region.

ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIPS:

Associate memberships are available to members’ spouses and children 18 years and under, still living at home. There must be at least one regular paid membership in the household to qualify. Associate members have the same rights as regular members with respect to participating in field trials (e.g., owning dogs, handling dogs, judging, bird planting, etc.). Associate member may not vote in any regional or national elections including rule or by-law changes, they cannot hold an office, and they do not receive a magazine.

Important things to remember (continued from previous page)

RULE CHANGES:

Proposed rule changes or new additions shall be submitted sixty (60) days prior to the first day of the Trial of Champions and/or the Dog of the Year trial.

CONSTITUTION/BY-LAW CHANGES:

All proposed amendments to the Constitution and By-laws shall be submitted to the National Officers at least ninety (90) days prior to the first day of the Trial of Champions and/or the Dog of the Year trial.

REGION HIGH POINT:

Points earned in the qualifying rounds of a Regional Elimination or a Championship trial DO count towards the region's high point competition. Points earned in the finals of above trials DO NOT count towards the region's high point.

OWNERSHIP CHANGE:

Once a dog takes a NSTRA placement, any subsequent ownership changes must be sent to the NSTRA office. Please send a copy of new registration papers with the new owners' names to the office. The date of transfer will be the date shown on the registration papers.

FIRST TIME PLACEMENTS:

The National Office now requires a copy of the dog's registration certificate for first time placements. This can either be submitted by the owner or the trial chairman. We will accept copies by fax (317-839-4197), e-mail (office@nstra.org), or a photocopy by regular mail.

NSTRA DISTINGUISHED MEMBERS:

The NSTRA Distinguished Members award honors those extraordinary men and women whose contributions and achievements significantly helped develop, or continued to improve, the National Shoot to Retrieve Field Trial Association, Inc. This award will be presented annually at the Dog of the Year banquet. Nominations may be submitted at any time to the staff at the national office, to a National Officer, or to the current chair of the Distinguished Members Committee. A short description of the individual and their contributions to NSTRA should be sent to the national office. A picture of the individual should be included, if

available. Contact the NSTRA office for a list of criteria. The committee will review all Nominations and verify contributions. Decisions will be made not only by the information submitted but by any other information collected. The committee will make their decision by the April Board of Directors' meeting. A permanent plaque will be located at the NSTRA office with a smaller plaque awarded to the individual or their family if deceased.



Getting Ready for Spring

Daylight Saving Time is a huge reminder that Spring is coming! It is a time for getting ready for the warmer weather and field trials!

Below is a checklist of things to help you and your dogs get ready for the active season ahead:

1. Make sure your dog is current on all vaccinations
2. Be sure that you include a heartworm check and medication in your schedule
3. Step up the cardio exercise--the hunting season is physically demanding so make sure your best hunting partner is prepared. **Swimming, running, and long walks** A great way to condition your dog is to take him swimming if your dog likes the water, or you can take your dog on long hikes, preferably in a large open field. Be aware that too much asphalt can be abrasive to your dog's feet.
4. Make sure that you are in good shape also--you are the other athlete in the field!
5. Make sure that the dewclaws are trimmed.
6. Clean ears as needed.
7. Make sure that your dog is eating the right amount of food. Don't leave it to guess work--weigh your dog! All dogs have an optimal weight, and it is important that you know your numbers.
8. Check your gear. Check out the latest gear with specialized vendors: Garmin, Red Haw, Dogs Unlimited, Gun Dog Supply, Moore etc., Deer Creek, Fausti, Farm Vet, Dakota
9. Clean your dog crates and any bedding
10. Check your First Aid Kit (see Vol 225 for a checklist by Bob West)
11. Make sure that your travel vehicle is in good shape, oil change, tires, etc.
12. Remember that a hunting dog is a happy dog
13. Have fun and be safe!







INTERVIEW WITH THADD TOWNSEND

Thad Townsend – Winner of 2021 National Shoot to Retrieve DOY Championship with Crosswind Shiver N Shake (Moose) -German Shorthair Male.

Recently, I had the opportunity to talk with Thadd for a post-trial interview. Thadd is a lifetime member of NSTRA, having joined in 2015 and a member of the MichiganRegion. Moose is a 3x NSTRA Champion and had his first placement on Dec. 8, 2018 in Fairchild, OH. In 2018 he placed 4th in a qualifying round at the 2018 UKC Championship and finished 13th overall. 1. How did you get started in NSTRA?

2. What was the name of your first dog?



Thadd: Moose is a dog with a very interesting life story. So, not actually, but close. Moose was just a young pup when he came back to our kennel. I began training him, and reluctantly liked him. My uncle always says it's the good dogs that are prone to injuries. Moose is no exception; he severed the main artery in his leg one day. I applied a tourniquet and called Scott, by sheer coincidence the vet was on his way out to our place. The vet said all we can do is stich him up and really gave us little hope. Moose laid motionless for about 6-8 hours until he opened his eyes. After he tarted to heal and recover, Moose seemed to bond to me and that's really where our journey began.

4. Did you train Moose yourself?

Thadd: Yes, I did begin training Moose when he came back to Crosswind Kennel. I also trained his father, Briar, Owned by Michael Elliott. Briar which was one of the most driven dogs I have ever seen.



5. How did you prepare for the DOY Championship?

Thadd: We did a little wild bird hunting prior to the trial, a lot of conditioning, and consistent training.

6. Which of the braces during the DOY week was the toughest?

Thadd: They are all tough. The quality of dogs in this organization combined with the experience, competitiveness, and great handlers makes competition in NSTRA is very tough.

7. When did you actually think you had a chance at the winning the championship?

Thadd: Never. We took it one brace at a time. After running against a dog that was born at Crosswind Kennel, Deuce, owned by Rich Chaimberlain, handled by Brian Boals, I believe it was the fourth round, I didn't think we would make it through. We had three (3) birds on the card, but I was confident it would take four (4). I have heard many of the old timers say sometimes "There has to be a little luck in this game." It ended up being true and we moved on.

8. Who has helped/influenced you the most in NSTRA?

Thadd: We all know the answer to this. Scott's guidance has been invaluable. My success in the organization reflects what he has taught me. Scott and I train together every day. I am fortunate enough to have the privilege of training alongside, in my opinion, one of the best to ever do. We would be foolish not to absorb his insight and knowledge. That goes the same for all of the men and women who have sacrificed and dedicated their time and energy to these amazing athletes.

9. What would you tell someone the best way to prepare for a championship trial?

Thadd: To remember your life is not achieving these accomplishments, that happens now and then. Winning a National is an exception or validation of your daily routine. Your routine is how these dogs greet you when you arrive, every day. Your life is how you train and the quality of your training, every single day. You get those mundane things right. Those things you do every day. You concentrate on them and you hone them, you perfect them. At that point you are like 80% there. The little things that are right in front of us, they are not so little, and its hard to set right, but if you set them right it will have a rippling effect. Don't forget – they are amazing animals. They will always give you 100%, inside and outside of competition.

10. What is your favorite memory from the 2021 DOY Championship?

Sharing the experience with and all the support from Marty Welsh, Dion Bliss, Jamie Laraway, Kara Laraway, and Scott Beaudette is second to none. Not only were Scott Beaudette and I lucky enough to have these amazing people rooting for us, but they also stayed with us to the end. Kara is always taking care of all of us when we go to these nationals, we owe her a debt we could never repay. What great people. Scott Beaudette and I train together every day. Going into a final hour with him and Trigger was an honor and a memory I will always cherish. Lastly, the words of wisdom and encouragement from Mike Barker, reassure that staying grounded will serve its purpose, advise from a great judge and great man. I am honored.



The backstory about Beau is:

The bond between man and dog is unmistakable to say the least. Jimmy Stewart loved his dog so much that, according to an excerpt from the book [Why We Love the Dogs We Do](#) by Stanley Coren, Stewart, who rarely made excessive demands when filming a movie, requested time off to see his ailing dog. 'A Dog Named Beau', also



known as just 'Beau,' was written by actor James Stewart. It was recited on "The Tonight Show" Starring Johnny Carson in 1981 and was published eight years later in a collection titled Jimmy Stewart and his Poems.

Here is what Coren wrote in the book:

...Stewart was making a picture which was shooting on location in Arizona. One evening he got a phone call from his veterinarian, a Dr. Keagy. The call was about Beau. Keagy told him that Beau was very sick. He was having trouble breathing and was in considerable pain. The disease had progressed to the point that it was obvious to Keagy that the dog couldn't be saved. He was calling for permission to end Beau's life quickly. Stewart's wife Gloria said that she couldn't make that decision since Beau was Jimmy's dog.

"I can't just tell you to put him to sleep like this," Stewart said, "Not over the phone-not without seeing him. You keep him alive and I'll be there." Stewart was always known as an easy actor to work with, who never made excessive demands. So, the director was taken aback when he went to him to ask for a few days off to fly home to see to his dog. The leave was granted and Stewart got to sit with Beau for a long while before making the decision. He later admitted that when he left the veterinarian's office he had to sit in his car for around 10 minutes, just to clear his eyes of tears, so that it would be safe to drive home.
